

Weekly Lenten services at Living Waters are beginning with the "Holden Evening Prayer" liturgy, and the music sets the tone as together we journey in confession and celebration of grace and of awe at the miracle of the empty tomb and the promise of life.

Each Wednesday evening we will hear God's Word and reflect on the "stones" we carry around—stones of rejection and hurt which weigh us down, stones we may contemplate tossing at someone else, hearts of stone unwilling to let God's love in.

Each week we will place a stone at the foot of the cross—lay at the feet of our Savior all of those things which separate us from him. Along the way, we will confess our faith, contemplate the truth about ourselves and stand together at the foot of the cross and lay our stones—and our sins—down, and leave in wonder of how God is lightening our load.

We will together journey through Holy Week and together proclaim the resurrection, to announce together the Good News, "He is risen!" We will see how we'd laid our sins at the cross and, behold! They'll be gone. The stone will be rolled away! Thanks be to God.

First Communion Class is Saturday, March 16 at 10:00 am in the Life & Learning Center. Children must be accompanied by at least one adult.

First Communion will be received on Maundy Thursday, March 28, or Easter Sunday, March 31. There will be a First Communion Class offered on Saturday, March 16th, 10:00 -Noon at Living Waters. This is open to all ages.

In the past, this class has been offered to 2nd graders. But with in-person classes not being possible for a couple years during COVID, some were not able to come for classes with a pastor and receive First Communion. This is one reason we are opening it up to all ages. Some may not have been able to attend classes for other reasons. One way or another, we want everyone to have an opportunity to learn about this sacrament and prepare for receiving it for the first time.

Parents and kids attend together. We walk through what the Sacrament of Communion means to us as Lutheran Christ followers. We'll also make clay chalices that students will paint. Will will bring them to an art shop to put in a kiln for the paint to glaze. And they'll have the chalices/cups for the day they will receive their First Communion, either Maundy Thursday on March 28 or Easter Sunday, March 31.







small groups that people can connect with. Groups will be promoted through brochures, Welcome Bags for visitors and our website.



## **Praying with St. Patrick**

So, who was St. Patrick? Every year on March 17th most in America honor St. Patrick's Day. That is the day said to be the date of his death, most likely in 461 A.D. Lutherans generally don't pray to the saints, but they have always honored them as people who have lived out their faith in awesome ways, amazing people who lived courageously as followers of Christ. St. Patrick is one of them. I read a bestseller once, *How the Irish Saved Civilization*, by Thomas Cahill—a kind American-Irishman lent it to me to read. My Irish sister-in-law, Eileen, loves the fact that through a couple of those DNA kits, we Norwegian-American Dyrhaugs figured out that we're actually part Irish.

St. Patrick was born in Roman Britain, and his father was a deacon, his grandfather a priest (Roman Catholic priests were able to marry up until the 11th century). At the age of 16 Patrick was captured by a group of Irish pirates. The raiders brought him back to Ireland where he was held captive for six years. Fleeing his master, he travelled to a port 200 miles away and persuaded the captain to take him. He ended up becoming a priest himself back in Britain and would return to Ireland as a Christian missionary to continue preaching the gospel and growing the church amongst the rough crowd of pagans there. He was eventually appointed bishop. His life served to see thousands of people baptized. This was not always a safe place to be, as you can imagine. Many are the priests and bishops, including a bishop of Sweden, who were cut down with a sword. Not all the peoples were so open to the Christian message. In the year of his death, likely in 461 A.D., the Roman Empire was falling apart in chaos as hordes of barbarians poured in. It is said that Ireland was one of the only places where

the books and the arts were not destroyed, and eventually learning and culture went out from there as Europe began its long period of the "Dark Ages" until the Middle Ages. That's why it's said the Irish saved civilization. My own Scandinavian ancestors would likely had never become Christians were it not for the Irish monks who were taken back to Norway and Sweden. I tell that to my sister-in-law all the time.

One of my favorite prayers is attributed to St. Patrick of St. Patrick's Day—written by this man I'd heard about for years but didn't know much about until the last few...

Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down,

Christ when I arise. Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth

Of everyone who speaks of me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that

hears me. I arise today. Through a mighty strength, the invocation of the Trinity, through belief in the threeness, through confession of the oneness of the Creator of Creation.

(How the Irish Saved Civilization, Anchor Books, New York, p. 1190)

Through the first few weeks of March, we'll continue to journey through Lent with the "Journey of Stones" services with Holden Evening Prayer and more awesome faith talks from people of Living Waters. Then as Christ-followers have done for centuries, we will gather in worship and prayer for Holy Week. Maundy Thursday service March 28th will be at 7:00 p.m., and Good Friday service at 7:00 p.m. As we will celebrate the stone rolled away and the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we will have services Easter Morning at 7:15, 9:00 and 10:30 a.m.
